RECESSIONAL TO THE BURIAL SITE

- Music is appropriate as the family leaves the church.
- A time can be arranged for the family to greet guests as they exit the church before going to the cemetery or when they return.
- If there will be a Committal Service at the gravesite, additional scriptures, poems or words can be shared.

QUESTIONS YOU MAY HAVE...

What costs are involved with using the church and pastoral team?

The use of the Sanctuary is offered at no charge; however, there are fees associated with a service at the church.

Soloist (if provided by the church): \$125

Organist: \$250 Porter: \$150

Sanctuary tech: \$125

Clergy for non-members: \$250

As a service to you, the church will coordinate the payment to the participants. You may write one check to Decatur First UMC and we

will distribute the funds accordingly.

Do I need a funeral home? For cremation, embalming, casket and burial services you will need the help of a funeral home. Decatur First is responsible for the worship service; we can also help in coordinating a reception should you so choose. Food and decorations are the responsibility of the family.

Which funeral home should I use? Our pastoral team has worked with most in the area. However, we recommend the following:

When should I plan the service?

It is customary to hold a service at the earliest 2-3 days following a death to allow time for notification of family and friends and for the information to be published in the newspaper.

What else do I need to know?

The clergy at DFUMC are available to be of assistance in planning, leading, and implementing a service of Christian worship suitable for a funeral or memorial service.

Inclusion of guest clergy not associated with DFUMC needs to be approved by the Senior Pastor, Rev. Dalton Rushing.

The church will provide printed bulletins. If you would like a slide show, please provide a USB flash drive with the pictures in a power point or Keynote format at least 3 days prior to the service. We provide a qualified sanctuary technician for a fee to run the slideshow. No flash photography is allowed during the service.

If the family prefers, in lieu of flowers a fund can be established at DFUMC as a memorial to the deceased.

Memory Garden

Our Memory Garden is a quiet place for your loved one's cremated remains. Ashes may be scattered or buried and a plaque on the garden wall honors those who are remembered there. If you prefer to have an interment only, the memory garden is limited to 12 people. For information, call the front office at 404-378-4541.

SUGGESTIONS FOR INCLUSION IN THE SERVICE

OLD TESTAMENT READINGS

NEW TESTAMENT READINGS

Presented by a pastor of your choosing

MUSIC

- Gathering music for pre-service selections might include favorite hymns of the deceased
- Hymns found in the United Methodist Hymnal congregational or sung as a solo
- Solo or ensemble music of a spiritual or comforting nature
- Other songs or music may be used after consulting with the presiding pastor
